Neil Keats | Making lace bobbins

Neil Keats writes:

Here is my "history" of making bobbins. I am 89 and have been woodturning for 60 years, a member of Woodturners of the Hunter since 1983 and making lace bobbins for the last 25 years. As I came across a different variety of bobbin, I turned a sample copy of it. I wound up with 42 patterns of Midlands bobbins, the most popular variety.

Unfortunately, in 2010 the Essential Tremor struck me, and my doctor prescribed a pill that suppressed the shaking of my hands and I could continue my woodturning.

In March last year heart problems meant changing medications and since then the tremor has worsened until now, I can't do woodturning or sign my name.

I am arranging for another member of the Woodturners to fill any orders for bobbins from lace makers. When all arrangements are finalised I will send you a further email with the details.
