
## I so LACE

Vicki gives us this insight into her latest project aiming for the Festival of Lace next February and for the AGM whenever it will be next held. These are pieces of Chantilly lace adapted from 'Bayeux Lace' by Marie-Catherine Nobecourt and Janine Potin, 'La Dentelle de Bayeux' by Mick Fouriscot and Mylene Salvador, Ulrike Voelcker and Brigitte Malherbe. They are made with DMC Perle 8 and Broder 16 cotton, and Linen 16/2. They are made to be used as teaching aids and, as a whole, made for an installation.





It was only a matter of time before a famous lace painting was attempted. Here Brooklyn Lace Guild's Elena Kanagy-Loux re-creates Vermeer's "Lacemaker". A handkerchief from Ann, originally from "La Encajera", but re-drawn and scaled for 50 Retors d'Alsace by Patricia Milne. Ann says, "I started this edge before Christmas 2019 but did not get very far due to Christmas holidays then I just kept putting it off, finding other projects to make. Thread in use is Aurifil 100% cotton Ne 50; I love using this thread. Don't you hate when you take great care to twist your threads at the start of roseground, only to find when you finally remove the pins you have missed one? Lace diary update: halfway along the next side, while admiring my work, I noticed a major careless mistake. Very disappointed, but errors are part of lace making: some you fix, others are beyond redemption."




Here's a suggested template (straight edge or from-a-point) for your bookmark entry into our State display at this year's AGM in Brisbane (and for repurposing in our entry in the Triennial Award 2021). Maximum size is 24x6cm (9x2.5") and minimum size is 18x2.5cm (7x1"). Any lace style, any grid size, any thread, but it must be in white or ecru. Closing date for submission of bookmarks is 31 August. Do more than one! P.S. You won't get your lace back after the event (think practising your rosegrounds/cane grounds, different spiders, ground variations or trails).



Bookmarks by Robin (an old ground design by Christine Johnson), Stef (a multiple-ways Biggins bookmark in two variegated pearl cottons; the spiders are all the six-legged examples in "Spinnen Spinnen Spinnen", by Hildegard Glos) and Rod (Untwisted Star Spider by Jenny Brandis, from the YouTube video of the same name, tipped into her Caneground bookmark, with Gutermann 100% Cotton 50).
