

PLEASE NOTE No crockery or cutlery will be available. No sharing of pens, eating utensils, food, lace items or lace gear.



LINNWOOD LACE DAYS

Information for Members

- Attendance at Linnwood House, which is located in a currently-designated COVID hotspot, is at your own risk and the Guild is not liable for any consequences arising (e.g. subsequent non-admission to businesses, organisations or institutions).
- *Members only;* no visitors or guests of members.
- Attendance (maximum 20) must be pre-booked at least a fortnight ahead of Lace Day by phoning or emailing Tanya (0412 745 339, tcarney@bigpond.com.au). This will be on a first-come-first serve basis no advance booking, no entry! After pre-booking, please phone/email your non-attendance in the case of any sudden illness.
- In the event of an outbreak sourced back to a Lace Day, your name, phone number/email address (from Membership Lists) will be made available to Cumberland City Council and NW Department of Health.
- Wearing a face mask is not mandatory but strongly recommended.
- Do NOT attend if feeling unwell in any way (fever, coughing, sneezing, runny nose, sore throat, shortness of breath, loss of smell), awaiting COVID-19 test results or have returned from overseas or been in contact with someone who has returned from overseas (or from an interstate hotspot) in the previous 14 days.
- Social distancing of 1.5 metres between attendees will apply at all times, including the Library (only one borrower at any one time), the Trading Table (one customer at any one time) and Door Entry (an orderly queue).
- Hand sanitiser is mandatory on entry and on departure.
- Branch Committee Members will enforce social distancing and logistics associated with the COVID Safe Health and Safety Plan.
- Eight tables in the Dining Room will accommodate two members each.
- The kitchen will be closed. Hot water will be available from our mini-urn. No communal cups, cutlery will be available from the kitchen. Members will ideally remove their own rubbish from the premises.
- The librarian will be stationed between 10am and 12noon at a table outside the Library to facilitate return of library books. One borrower at a time may use the library. If a representative from a Lace Group wants to borrow/return books on behalf of Lace Group members, they should talk to the Librarian ahead of Lace Day. The Trading Table will operate between 10am and 12noon only. The photocopier will be unavailable for use.
- Members must refrain from allowing others to touch or closely examine their lace and lace equipment. No sharing of lace gear is permitted.
- \$10 Door Entry will be charged at Lace Day. To minimise risks associated with queuing and handling cash, please bring a single \$10 note. No change provided.



• No one-on-one lace tuition or group training activity such as a mini-workshop will be permitted unless 1.5 metre distance between participants is strictly maintained at all times.

- 2. Correspondence Course. The correspondence course is no longer available, but is being translated into a DVD which will be available for sale. Further details are to be gathered at this year's NAC meeting in Launceston. If available, the NSW Branch could sell copies at lace demonstrations.
- 3. AGM Raffle. Pat McDonell drew the AGM raffle. First prize of the wooden box was won by Andrew Sutherland. Six runners-up prizes were won by Mollie Macinante, Dinah Hales, Karen Noonan, Annette Meldrum and Norma Warnecke. There being no further business, the meeting closed at 2.13pm.

NSW President's Report 2019/2020 to National Annual General Meeting

This last year has been a mix of celebration and isolation for many of our members and groups. The plans previously in place have had to be cancelled, postponed, or modified. Along with everyone, New South Wales lace makers have innovated to maintain contact and continue to make lace.

Members and Groups. There were 236 lace makers in NSW and the ACT at 2 August 2020, a decrease of 18. Age and illness are having its effects on the membership. Unlike previous years where members have been able to promote lace making and attract new members this has not been possible. Congratulations go to all our groups who have maintained meetings via the internet. This is not easy as the standard of internet varies significantly across suburbs and towns. The introduction of *Isolace* a emailed newsletter has allowed members to keep in touch and showcase what they have been doing while in lockdown. The newsletter allowed for more frequent communication with members including country members. A big thanks to Rod for coordinating this and everyone who contributed.


Workshops. The only workshops that went ahead were Lieve's Paris Lace in August 2019 and Christine's Torchon Lace in November. For 2020 all workshops were cancelled as venues closed. The announcement by the state government that the Powerhouse Museum at Ultimo would remain open, has given some hope the workshops in Ultimo can recommence sometime in the future.

Demonstrations. The Penrith and Wagga Wagga Craft Alive shows in February and early March provided an opportunity for local members to promote lace to the wider community. The demonstrations planed for the Sydney Royal Easter Show and the varies craft shows around the state have all been cancelled. 2021 will hopefully bring the craft shows back and the opportunity to showcase the Guild.

40th Anniversary Celebrations. At the December Lace Day the NSW Branch held its official celebrations for the 40th Anniversary of the formation of the Lace Guild. The day started with the display of all the entries in the Anniversary Lace competition, the announcement of the category winners and presentation of certificates to all participants. The NSW display from Launceston was rehung for the day. The Lace Day then moved to the Guildford Leagues Club for a presentation by Rosemary and a slide show of photos from the 40 years of the NSW Branch. The slide show was the source of much amusement and comment. The most often heard comment was "Look how young I was or you were!" The event finished with Rosemary cutting the Anniversary cake and members enjoying the cake for afternoon tea.

Annual General Meeting. The NSW Branch Annual General Meeting has been postponed to December 2020. At the time of writing Linnwood House the location of the Branch meetings may be open for large gatherings. With COVID restrictions currently easing, the Branch is planning on holding a limited Lace Day on the first Sunday in October 2020. Numbers are limited so to accommodate as many members as possible within the COVID Safe plan a morning and afternoon session will be held.

We are looking forward to a better 2021.
